BACKGROUND

This project entitled BACHPAN is acronym of “Building Atmosphere for Child's Holistic Development Protection & Nurturing”. BJUP is implementing the programme in the slum areas of Bihar sharif with support from Stichting Kinderpostzegels Nederland, The Netherlands This project aims to protect and nurture the children in need of care & protection due to separation from their families for varied reasons. The Project intervention areas are Slums viz. Baridargah, Alinagar, Jhingnagar, Sorabipar. Mirganj, Paharpura & amp; Kataranadi of Bihar Sharif.

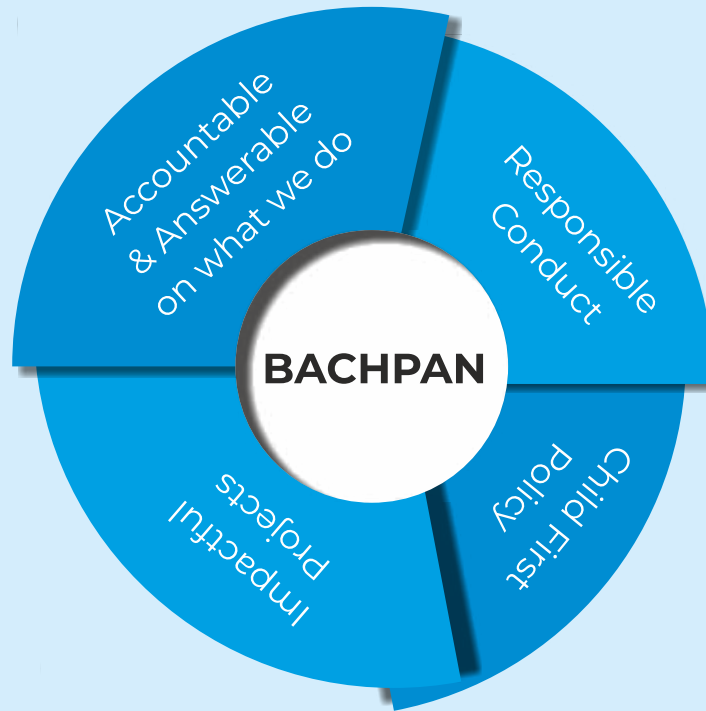
Through this project, BJUP ensures that every child must get equal opportunities for their future.

AIM OF PROJECT

Psycho-Social and Physical development of children in need of care & Protection for making them responsible and independent citizens of the country”.

ACHIEVEMENT

- On monthly basis throughout the year, thirty children were provided support like education material books & stationary, remedial classes and preventive health care support.
- Regular health camps and treatment, sanitary napkins for girls, linkages with local government schemes, Nutritional support food supplements to malnourished and needy children were main components of the project.
- Total 84 Child club meeting organized by BJUP in the year and total 1105 children attended this meeting.
- Total 84 monthly Slum committee meeting organized by BJUP in the year & total 1006 participants attended this meeting.
- Total 4 quarterly Child club protection committee meetings were organized by BJUP and 96 participants attended it. Different child rights 2/3 child protection issues were discussed for a real time reporting of child right violation issues.
- Regular IEC activities for accessing the government schemes and Services
- Street play for raising awareness on vulnerable children issue was organized in all seven slums.
- Distributed Sanitary Napkins in Six schools at targeted area on monthly basis, Total 210 adolescent girls were benefitted through Sanitary Napkin distribution.
- Organized session in 06 government schools on menstrual hygiene & reproductive health related among adolescent girls.
- Supported different sports materials among child club members.
- Regular games and quiz competitions among children and 154 children participated.
- Organized Health check-up camps and free medicine support to children for preventive health, 43 children were benefitted from these camps
- Two meeting a one with Govt. School for mainstreaming the children in school education.
- Total 4 quarterly meeting with the families of children were organized. Discussions were held on role and responsibilities of child protection committee and Child Clubs.



CASE STUDY

Raushani Parveen (name changed) is an 14 years adolescent girl living in Katarandi slum of Bihar Sharif . She is living with her parents who are HIV positive. Her father was a daily labour and was only source of income for family. Due to poor health condition of her father, Raushani was forced to work in a tea stall look after her family. Her parents were not linked in treatment centre for HIV treatment. During one child protection committee meeting, BJUP came to know the status of Raushani. BJUP team visited the family to assess the situation. Her parents were imminently linked with ART center and PLHIV network. Family was counselled and Raushani was reenrolled in government school.

As an immediate relief, BJUP started to provide daily ration for the family and link at them with government public distribution system. BJUP also linked the family with governments Parvarish scheme.

After the necessary support and treatment from ART center, health condition of her parents was improved, Raushani was re-enrolled in the school. Project team accompanied her to a ICTC center Bihar Sharif for her HIV testing and found negative.

Now Raushani is happily studying in class VII she is happily going to school.

Now Raushani and her siblings & sister all are very happy, and her parents are feeling good.

BACHPAN- SCALE UP

Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad with the support from Azim Permji Philanthropic initiative, Bangalore, has scale up BACHPAN Project in 10 more slum areas of Bihar Sharif. The project is protecting children who are separated from their families for various reasons and nurturing them by creating a favorable conducive environment. The learning and field experience gained from BACHPAN pilot has been incorporated in the design of BACHPAN. scale up to provide a comprehensive package of children who are vulnerable and in need of help and support. The project area is mainly inhabited by minorities, schedule castes and other backward communities who are considered as the weakest sections of the society.

AIM OF PROJECT

“Psycho-Social and physical development of children in need of care and protection for making them responsible and independent citizens of the country”.

ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS :

- Conducted Base Line survey and need assessment to map the children who are vulnerable and need further care, support and protection.
- Identified 572 vulnerable children and provided necessary support for their well-being in 10 slums of project areas.
- Collaborated with local ward members, Anganwadi, and other line departments like CWC, DCPU and civil society organizations to create a conducive environment for the children.
- BJUP formed 09 child clubs with 135 children involved to address their need and support.
- BJUP has formed 09 Guardian Committees with 81 Guardian to create a safety net for the vulnerable children addressing child protection and rights.
- BJUP has formed Community child protection committee with 21 active members to ensure a safe and healthy environment for the children in project areas.
- 270 children actively participated in 18 monthly child club meeting in the year.
- BJUP organized 28, monthly parents committee meeting in this year and total 259 participants attended this meeting.
- Different Awareness generation through IEC activities was organized for facilitating flagship schemes and provisions for the children.

CASE STUDY



It is always an unthinkable feeling for an outsider to understand the feeling of suppression to be in lower caste especially Dom community. The Dom community is the most marginalized, even among schedule caste communities. They still face all sorts of discriminations in the society, therefore they mostly remain illiterate. Here is a story of girl Mehndi Kumari, this will take us to her journey from being an illiterate to a learner.

BJUP works with the support of APPI in Mansoor Nagar Dom Toli. This Tola is mainly inhabited by Musher & Dom. The main occupation of this community is to clean the human excreta and other dirt. Almost 100% Children are engaged either in rag picking or work as a child labor or as domestic helper. During initiation of this intervention the project team came across that, not a single child is enrolled in any school this is either due to their involvement in miniscule income generating activities to supplement family income or due to caste discrimination.

Initially BJUP team had a meeting with elders of community for making them aware about APPI supported interventions. The importance of education was also discussed with them. The team had also interacted with children of operational areas and started organizing them in Child Club. During the formation of Child club, it was found that very few children have minimum required writing skills. Under this project the children were provided with the slate & copy and started being taught to how to write their names. Regular practice was ensured with child club members. Due to rigorous effort one of child club member Mehndi has started writing her name and now in child club meeting she has started to make her signature. Therefore, now she is a role model of her Child Club.

This is our initial step.....we have to walk and run miles to achieve our project goal.

SAVING THE CHILDHOOD

BACKGROUND

Women and children together constitute about 67.7% of the country's population as per 2011 Census. Empowerment and protection of women and children and ensuring their whole some development is crucial for sustainable and equitable development of the country. Bharitya Jan Utthan Parishad Bihar, in support with Hand in Hand India is implementing “Promoting Child Friendly and Sustainable Communities Project at 10 villages of Rajauli Block of NAWADA District. The project was started in November 2019. The project goal is to improve the lives of Children and Women engaged in Mica Collection by improving their education, health and hygiene. Our intervention focuses on increasing their income level by providing income generating activities and ensuring the protection and rights of the children through various child clubs, child protection committees at village level .The project aims to improve education status by ensuring each and every child going to school, provided with stationary and learning material time to time, so that each and every child must enjoy a happy childhood.

AIM OF PROJECT

1. To improve the health status of both, children and women in the MICA collection areas.
2. Improve the status of income level by ensuring extension in livelihood options.
3. Convergence with the government schemes and linking it with the families for social security/ assistance.
4. Capacity building of women and other stakeholders including PRIs.
5. Educating community on the importance of Health and Hygiene.
6. Protecting the basic rights of children in need of care and protection.

ACHIEVEMENT

- We have identified 25 slow learners children from those 10 villages by accessing their existing level of knowledge. The focus is to prepare children for mainstream schooling.
- Through our intervention, we established one Community learning center in targeted location where we have enrolled these 25 children and organize regular activities like – bridge education. Remedial classes, nutritional supplements for all children enrolled in Learning centre.
- Important days and festivals were celebrated with the children through songs, dance, and speeches.
- Three health camps, focusing on dental care and others general health camps were organized in support with District Government Hospital. One of the health camp was for women where more than 700 women, children and men were reached during these camps.
- Organized entry level point programmed in school, with different activity like painting, essay and competition and the aim to increase the level of education among the school going children.
- Screening of children is done at Anganwadi center using WHO guidelines and the metric to determine nutritional status and identify malnourished children.

- Identified of 10 malnourished children and enrolled them into Nutrition Rehabilitation Centre.
- Organized monthly meetings with different PRI, Government counter part and other Stake holders to address the bottle neck of the project.
- Initiation of savings and credit activities, and promotion of income generating programs by creating Self Help Groups.
- BJUP started two Mother Collective Groups, comprising of 30 women members. We ensure women empowerment and their financial security by enhancing their income.

CASE STUDY

Ms. Savitri Devi, a woman from family of 10 members in our project is living at Dumarkol Panchayat of Rajauli Block. She belongs to one of the mahadalit family. She is gifted with four children. After she enrolled in mother collective group, it came to our notice that Savitri Devi's younger daughter Pushpa (name changed) is suffering from malnourishment which is affecting her child's overall development. Project team visited her house and saw children have nutritional deficiency. Team made the family aware of the health services provided through Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres and also informed them of mental and physical disorders caused due to malnutrition in children. But due to the family responsibility in the absence of her husband and non-interest from her other family members, Ms. Savitri along with her daughter were helpless to get enrollment in them to NRC. After making her more comfortable with different approaches counseling sessions, Ms. Savitri Devi came forward with intention to save her daughter's life who is suffering from severe acute malnourished as suggested by expert Doctors. On 26th Feb 2020 Savitri Devi and her daughter Pushpa were admitted to the NRC center located at Rajauli Sub-division hospital. Finally, after one month of strong intervention and support under NRC, her daughters health condition improved, she started gaining weight, now Savitri Devi expresses her feeling that she is very satisfied after receiving good services under NRC. She wants to thank all those who supported her in absence of her husband. Now she shares her story to everyone who faces similar issues.



DEVENDRA ITI

BACKGROUND

The training course run with the affiliation of NCVT, New Delhi, is amazingly effective program as youths are involved for employment generation and livelihood promotion. Devendra ITI got the recognition from NCVT, New Delhi in the year of 2010 and the session started from July 2011. It is very pertinent program for the fact that it is named after the founder General Secretary Late Mr. Devendra Prasad Singh who sacrificed his life for the social cause in the field of integrated development. One of his focus and objectives was to generate employment opportunities for the youth in the rural inhabitants and hence ITI was established in Ghoshrawan village one Panchayat of Giriyak Block. It provides training to the youth in the areas of electrician and fitter. Due to effective and good training style it has been observed that since its inception it encourages the participation of rural youths especially mahadalit and other backward castes from all over Bihar, getting participation from everywhere as the organization has facilities for free accommodation with provision of free scholarship for the needy youth, apart from the courses on industrial training organization also imparts free computer education. This year 80 student are enrolled in the ITI, in which majority of students belong to SC/OBC. A good percentage of employment opportunities are created for the youth being attached to various firms of govt. and private concern. The Center has 32 staff in which 15 are skilled trainers for the trades of the center and 17 support staff for better management.

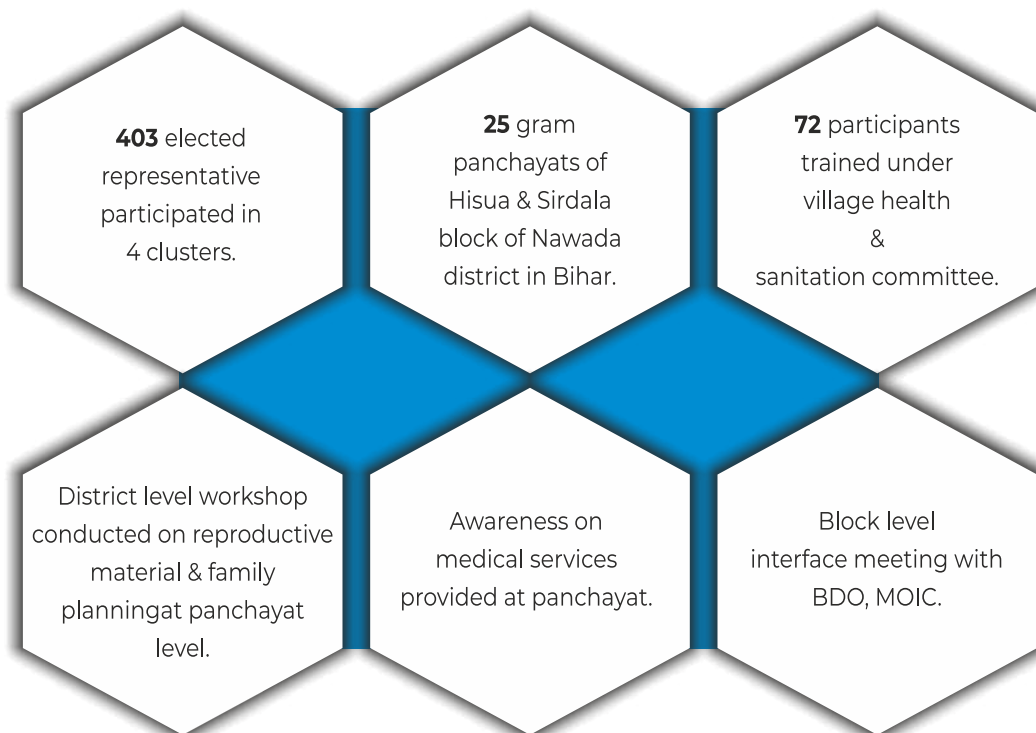
PAHEL (Women Leading Change)

BACKGROUND

BJUP with support from Center for Catalyzing Change, New Delhi is implementing PAHEL Project at Hisua and Sirdala Block of Nawada District. The project aimed to sensitize and empower women members of Panchayat Raj Institution on mother and child health issues. The purpose of the project was to Sensitize all elected Panchayat members (specially women members) including Mukhiya, Ward Members, Block Center Manager on their roles to ensure mother and child health related activities in their respective health centers. BJUP has worked in 10 Panchayat of Hisua Block & 15 Panchayat of Sirdala Block. Out of total 25 Panchayat, BJUP conducted assessments and screened 261 elected representatives of Panchayat Raj. Out of 261 Elective Members, 183 were women ward members and 51 were men ward members who were also members of village Health Sanitation & Nutrition Committee. This project also creates awareness and skills of panchayat functionaries, including women to enhance their confidence and capabilities to address the core issues of day-to-day local governance.

AIM OF PROJECT

- To Sensitize the Elected representatives (Specially woman PRI members) towards their Roles and Responsibilities on Health issues.
- To Sensitize the Government official and services provided at Health Sub Center, Anganwadi Centers and Primary Health Centers towards maternal Health .
- Popularize the concept of maternal care and take an active part to restore the gaps & fulfill the demands of women.
- Awareness about the Toll-free number of 104 to complain and get medical advice service.



CASE STUDY

Mrs. Runti Devi, a woman from backward caste stays at Ariyan village of Chatihar Panchayat in Hisua block. She was an elected PRI member. BJUP team reached Mrs.Runti Devi and made her aware about the Pahel initiatives. Mrs.Runti then shared that she wants to do something great for the people and wants to serve the communities for the development work Then BJUP team informed her about the Pahel project interventions and disused details about the roles and responsibilities as elected representatives towards



serious and core local issues. After regular follow-up and actions Mrs. Runti understood her role as leader and taken up the work in line with Pahel project, she now supports each and every initiative under the project and act as an active member of change, she holds several meetings with women at village level and also interacts with government members involved in the process of health, education. She mobilized several women in cluster meetings organized in ward Sabha. She also supported team BJUP to conduct assessment on health and any related survey at village level. Mrs. Runti Devi said “BJUP conducted several trainings on Maternal and child health, family planning for elected representatives like her and tried hard to bough a positive change by recognizing the importance of being an elected representative.” One of the benefits that she gains out of those training is confidence and leadership.

She shared a case of her sister-in-law who have three children, she convinced her sister-in-law and her husband, on importance of family planning. She also convinced her sister-in-laws husband to undergo vasectomy in nearby PHC. Mrs. Runti said that she gained a lot after project Pahel intervention, her confidence and level of knowledge towards the core issues has increased which is benefiting her to perform her role as ward member. She said with the support of BJUP, many woman representatives like her, understood the role and responsibilities as ward members towards development work.



COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

BACKGROUND :

Community Empowerment program is started with the Support of Responsible Mica Initiative (RMI), Paris with intervention in 40 villages in Koderma, Giridih and Nawada districts of Jharkhand and Bihar, India. As a lead agency, BJUP is working in 10 villages and support implementing in local NGOs (Abhivyakti Foundation, Samajik Parivartan Sansthan & Samarpan) villages in Giridih & Koderma districts of Jharkhand.

The Community Empowerment Program is transforming communities in the mica region for long-term and self-sustainable remedies to the underlying causes of child labor and poor working conditions. Launched in 2018, 40 villages and 5,800 households are already benefiting from programs, including better schools and health care delivery, access to more diverse sources of livelihood and receipt of government services.

The villages were selected with specific criteria including the high dependency of communities on mica for their livelihoods (more than 75% of households depending on mica for their living), higher concentration of the disadvantaged social groups, higher rates of illiteracy and dropout of children from schools, community willingness to work with the project in a self-help approach.

Under this program BJUP works, both as Grant Management agency and Implementing agency to achieve the project objective & also develop design, implementation plan, and supportive supervision of the program

AIM OF PROJECT :

The Project aims to enhance the overall well being of the most vulnerable Mica dependent families engaged in mica related business activities directly or indirectly. It has four broader objectives to fulfill, long term goal to ensure a fair and transparent mica supply chain in India. These objectives are:

Livelihood: To increase income of MICA and Non- MICA household in 40 villages of Koderma, Nawada & Giridih, Jharkhand.

Health Nutrition & WASH : To improve health and nutrition status of women and children in the community.

Rights & Entitlement : To improve access to socio-economic entitlements of MICA and NON-MICA household in 40 villages of Nawada of Bihar and Koderma & Giridih of Jharkhand.

Education : All the children of Mica dependent families will have access to quality & formal education in age group of 6-14 years.

ACHIEVEMENTS AS IMPLEMENTING PARTNER :

1. Livelihood:

- 106 Community meetings conducted in 10 villages.
- 15 Households supported for start-up business under Income Generating Program through Financial support.
- Total 469 animals were vaccinated and treated from 4 villages.
- 4 Stitching centers opened at village level.
- 38 candidates joined vocational training at stitching centre.
- 146 villagers participated in training on improved agriculture & Livestock practice.

2. Health & Nutrition

- 4 Anganwadi centers developed as Model Anganwadi.

- Medical treatments were provided to 300 children through 2 health camps.
- 223 children were screened for Malnutrition. The screening has the potential to identify children who are malnourished.
- 7 children admitted for nutrition camp and 3 Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) children recovered to normal stage.
- 111 Households were supported for kitchen garden to improve nutritional well being.
- 441 peoples were treated in Health Camp.
- 2 hand wash demonstration to foster and support a global culture of hand washing with soap.
- 2 times meeting with Child development project officer to discuss local issues like services to pregnant women, mothers, children between the age group of 0-6 years & Adolescent girls.
- 2 Hand pumps repaired to solve the problem of water.

3. Rights & Entitlements

- 31 beneficiaries linked with Aadhaar card.
- 452 beneficiaries linked with Ayushman Bharat Scheme, so they get healthcare cover of Rs.5 lakh per family.
- 1 beneficiary Linked with old age scheme and linked with widow pension scheme.
- 50 New Bank accounts opened for new beneficiaries in 10 villages.
- 3 Toilet construction families supported for construction under MGNREGA.

4. Education

- 292 kids receiving pre-schooling facility from Balwadi.
- 110 youth are actively participating in Bal Manch.
- 70 meetings conducted with Bal Manch.
- 46 peer educators trained on life skills.
- 15 children received scholarship for continuing education in 10 villages.
- In 5 schools learning assessment conducted on Language & Math subjects for class 3 & 5 students.
- Supported 5 school for the Development & Use of Teaching-Learning Materials (TLMs).
- Sports materials provided to 5 schools (including Football, Cricket bat).
- Bal Sabha a platform to perform and the occasion for parents teacher interaction regularized in 5 schools.
- Provided advance teachers training to 10 teachers. 3 Panchayat Resource Person (PRPs) and 3 Cluster Resource Coordinator (CRCs).
- One review and planning meeting with 17 teachers. ICRC and IBRP at Chiarelli CRC.
- Child committee formed in 5 schools.
- Books distributed for school library in 5 schools.
- 561 school dropouts were enrolled back to schools (many of whom were child laborer's)
- 20 SMC & PRI members participated in SMC Training.
- 5 Community libraries established in the neighborhood for children.
- 2 Bal mela conducted.
- Meetings with District education department to discuss the existing status to monitor the educational, legal and administrative activities at Government schools.



SUCCESS STORY



Moti Ravidasisa 50-year-old Shoemaker from village of Hardiya Panchayat under Rajauli Block of Nawada District. He lives in 10x10 feet house with his seven daughters out of which five got married and two stays with Ravidas. He is the only earner for the entire family. Ravidas came to know that his younger daughter, Rashmi, is suffering with kidney diseases he admitted her daughter for good treatment at AIM Hospital. Ravidas spent all his saving for the treatment and his cobbler business also come to an end. Ravidas was struggling for earning and to kick up his business again, he was exploring financial support from his relatives and friends. One day, Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad team came to know about the case. Team visited the house and accessed his current situation and living condition. BJUP decided to support Ravidas to kick up his old business with financial support of Rs. 10,000. Ravidas was living in very poor condition without any basic amenity. Within three-months of the support Ravidas again reopened his shoe repairing shop in the market. Now, Ravidas has emerged as a fine example for others in the village, as his hard work and dedication in cobbler business is paying off good, to earn his daily livelihood.

Message from Moti Ravidas: I have taken help from all my friends and relatives, cannot ask for more from them, I am very thankful to the organization who helped me during this trouble so that I can run my shop again."

TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT

BACKGROUND :

BJUP in collaboration with Bihar State AIDS Control Society had started the project with the aimed to target the 700 High Risk Groups (HRGs). This project with the name “Targeted intervention” is running in four blocks of Nalanda District of Bihar state. The project is trying to arrest the spread of HIV among female sex workers and Man Sex with Man in Rajgir tourist areas .The HRGs who are in the age group of 18-45 years, are eligible to register under this project. Currently total 856 HRGs are getting services from this program among which 739 are female sex workers (FSW) and 117 are men who have sex with men (MSM).

AIM OF PROJECT :

- To provide effective and innovative BCC to HRG to enhance their knowledge and treatment seeking behavior.
- To provide Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) treatment to the HRGs to reduce the incidence of STI amongst the targeted community.
- To promote consistent and correct use of condom among the targeted groups.
- To establish drop in facilities for FSWs & MSM.
- To promote the proper use of condom and the awareness about sexual transmitted diseases among the targeted group.

ACHIEVEMENT :

- This year total 2797 High risk group has been reached through BCC and counseling.
- 28 STI cases has been diagnosed among FSW and MSM and provided treatment
- Total 2658 High risk group people received clinical support through regular medical checkup.
- 1432 FSW and MSM were tested for HIV AIDS.
- 151660 free Condoms were distributed among the targeted group through the outlets.
- 507 FSW and MSM were screened for Syphilis.
- 126 new FSW were registered in this year.
- Organized 48 Focussed Group Discussion (FGD) with HRGs on different topics.
- Provided Medicines to our 28 STI HRG as per recommended by Doctors.



VIHAAN

BACKGROUND :

BJUP implementing a Global Fund (GFTAM) supported project to provide Care and support of HIV/AIDS positive people, called “Vihaan”. Vihaan is a national initiative establishing and managing 350 Care & Support Centers (CSCs) across India to expand access to essential services, increase treatment adherence, Reduce stigma and discrimination and improve the quality of life of people living with HIV (PLHIV). Vihaan CSCs are committed to the health and wellbeing of all PLHIV and their affected families, with special effort to reach those from underserved populations, including women, children and members of high-risk groups. FSW, MSM, transgender, Hijras and People Who Inject Drugs (PWID).

Vihaan provides access to range of quality care & support services using an integrated approach that complements existing HIV prevention and treatment programming. Working in coordination with nearby ART Centers, CSCs serve as safe spaces for PLHIV offering services that include counseling, outreach and follow-up support health referrals, and linkages to social welfare schemes.

AIM OF PROJECT

To reach the long-term goal of improving the standard of life, Reduction of Stigma and discrimination from the life of PLHIV. We have the following objectives:

- To improve health and hygiene practices among PLHIV.
- Early linkages of PLHIV to care and support centers in treatment services.
- To improve nutritional support to PLHIV.
- To promote social protection and wellbeing of PLHIV.
- To improve enabling PLHIV friendly environment.
- To strengthen community system to reduce the stigma and discrimination.

ACHIEVEMENT

- Total 884 Patients were registered during this assessment year.
- Total 5247 patients were active in CSCs.
- Total 1154 patients were counseled this year.
- Total 2236 follow visits done during this year.
- Organized 3 advocacy meetings in this year.
- 585 Home visits was conducted during this year.
- Referral services were given to 490 patients.
- Total testing Report in this year 380.
- 848 patients were identified during TB screening test.
- 9 Coordination meetings were organized with ART.
- Linkages developed with government schemes and services:
 - a. MGNREGA registration and benefit-210 beneficiaries.
 - b. Parvarish scheme benefit-35 beneficiaries.
 - c. Bank A/C cpemomg-02 beneficiaries.
 - d. Pan Card registration -4 beneficiaries.
 - e. Aadhar registration-321 beneficiaries.
 - f. Other Pension Related Scheme-80 beneficiaries.
 - g. Ration Card registration-8 beneficiaries.

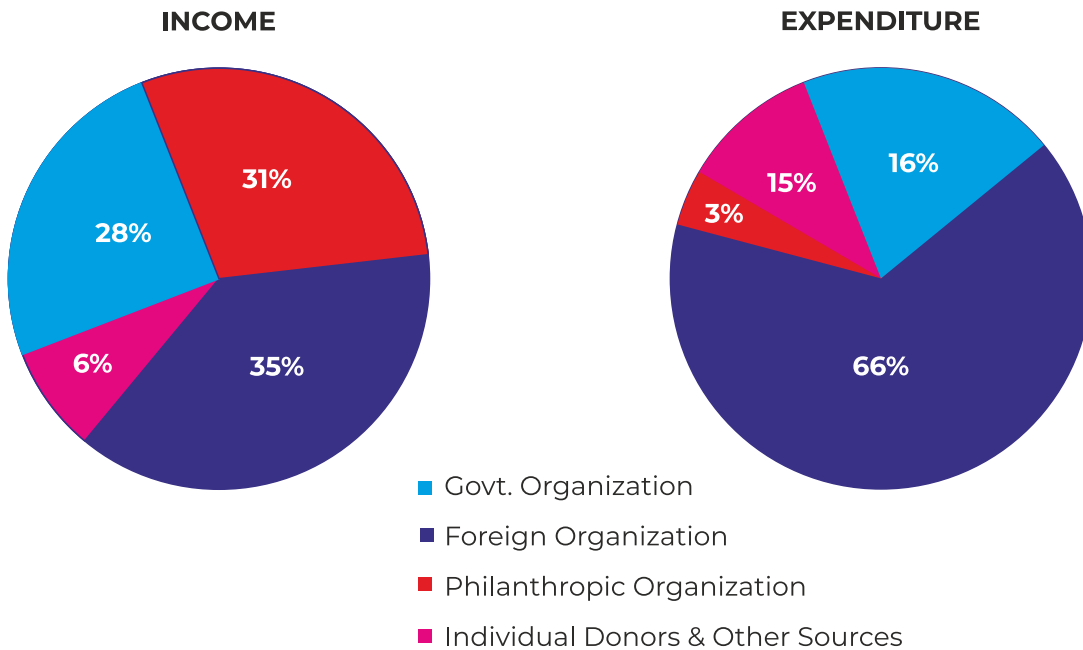

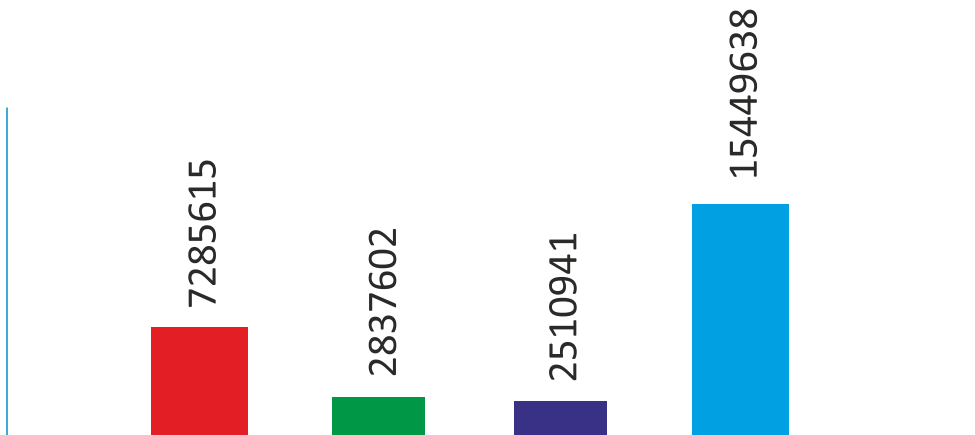

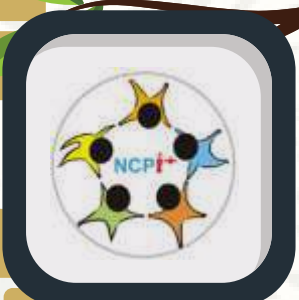
